Marsha Moffitt

Marsha Moffitt has been a cellist with the Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra since 1980, becoming a core member of the cello section in 1991. An active freelance musician, Marsha has toured with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet as principal cellist, and performed with many orchestras throughout Southern Ontario. Marsha has extensive chamber music experience and was a member of the quartet in residence at the Shaw Festival for two seasons. She has performed with chamberWORKS! and the Talisker Players (Toronto), among others. Currently Marsha is a member of the piano trio Amis Musicaux in residence at Redeemer University College. She can be heard on several recordings, including a Juno-nominated recording for young people.

Marsha is much in demand in the community as an educator. She teaches at Redeemer University College, coaches several chamber music ensembles, conducts a highly successful adult amateur string orchestra, adjudicates at area music festivals, and maintains a busy private cello studio. She is frequently invited to teach at summer music camps, including those in Saskatoon and Lakefield, Ontario. In addition, Marsha is a key member of the HPO's Education Committee, contributing the development of the HPO's Teacher Resource Guide and formulating and shaping the HPO's in-school programs.

Marsha has been the Chair of the HPO Players' Committee since 2002, serving as a non-voting member of the HPO's Board of Directors, and chairing and sitting on various advisory and search committees on behalf of the musicians of the Philharmonic.
